



Learning Together at Edenton Street FAQ

Is there a difference between the services offered at the two locations?

No. Learning Together at Edenton Street and Learning Together at Lenoir Street will offer the same high-quality, super-inclusive pre-k education program. Both locations will provide therapy services for qualified children, healthy meals and snacks daily, and focus on social-emotional learning in addition to academics.

What ages will you be enrolling at Learning Together at Edenton Street?

At this time, Learning Together at Edenton Street will enroll children between the ages of 2.5 and 5 years old.

How do I enroll my student at Learning Together at Edenton Street?

Children enrolled at Learning Together are placed into classrooms based on the needs of the child and the need for balance and inclusion in our classrooms. Families may request either location but will not be guaranteed placement at either location.

If my child is already enrolled at Learning Together at Lenoir Street, can I choose to transfer them to Learning Together at Edenton Street?

No. Children enrolled at Learning Together are placed into classrooms based on the needs of the child and the need for balance and inclusion in our classrooms. Families may request either location but will not be guaranteed placement at either location.

If my child is already enrolled at Learning Together at Lenoir Street, can I choose to have them remain at Learning Together at Lenoir Street?

No. Children enrolled at Learning Together are placed into classrooms based on the needs of the child and the need for balance and inclusion in our classrooms. Families may request either location but will not be guaranteed placement at either location.

If I have two children at Learning Together, will they be placed in separate locations?

No. Learning Together will ensure that children from the same family will be placed at the same location.

Will there be a cost difference between the two locations?

No. Both Learning Together locations will charge the same amount for tuition. Both locations will work with the Department of Health and Human Services to accept Childcare subsidies, and both locations will offer limited scholarships.

Will Learning Together at Edenton Street be a provider for Wake County Public Schools?

Yes. Learning Together at Edenton Street will work with WCPSS to provide inclusive services to 3-year olds with Individualized Education Plans.



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Who will be teaching at each location?

We are still determining the exact roster for teachers. Some teachers currently working at Learning Together at Lenoir Street will transfer to Learning Together at Edenton Street and some will remain at Lenoir Street. All new teachers hired will be required to have the same qualifications as our current teachers – a bachelor's degree in an Early Childhood Education field and a Birth through Kindergarten teaching license.
