Learning Together Recovery Update Week 11

Hello Friends,

As we approach the three month mark of losing access to our space at the Crosby-Garfield Building due to building damage, we have some new updates to share. Yesterday, Head Start, a federally funded program, was able to resume their services in the building. They are currently utilizing our entrance and corridor to access their space as the main door to the building and surrounding areas are still under construction.

Our classroom and office spaces have been re-licensed by Wake County as storage space for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year. Therefore, our earliest reopening there would be the start of the 2023-24 school year.

We are again choosing to find the silver lining in this experience. We believe this is an opportunity to work with Wake County to make long-overdue repairs and renovations above and beyond the damage from the gas leak incident. The significant historical and communal value of the Crosby-Garfield Building should not be minimized.

Going forward, our recovery updates will be delivered every other week unless we have time-sensitive news to share. Look for our Week 13 recovery update on September 27. We will also resume our regular monthly organization/school newsletter beginning in October.
